## What does this Program Cost?

The cost of the program is \$425 per participant (\$250 for students). It may be paid by the participant, employer, sponsor, or from a combination of sources.

Limited scholarship assistance is available based on financial need.

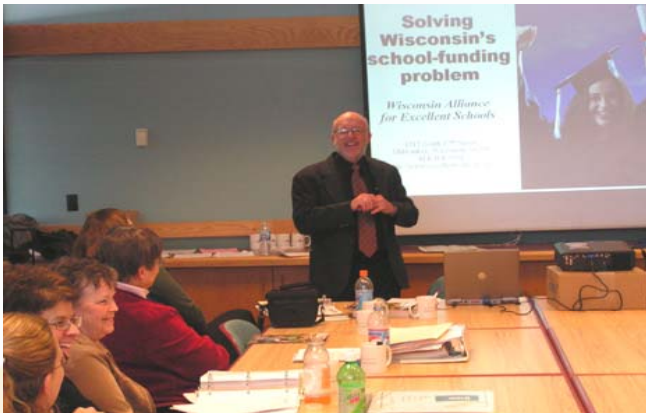


## What is the Institute of Leadership?

The Sauk County Institute of Leadership is a nine-month leadership development program consisting of an initial two-day retreat followed by one-day workshops and a graduation dinner. The workshops are held throughout Sauk County on the second Thursday of each month from September through May.

Each session will focus on a different aspect of community leadership. The workshops will share information by utilizing both local and non-local experts and will be focused on keeping the learning process interesting and practical.

Each participant will also have the opportunity to be involved in a community-based project. In other words, you won't have to wait until the end of the program to start making a difference in your community!
